
Welcome back to J-Popcon, honoured guests from far and near!

FOREWORD

Dear guests,

This year is quite a special year for us in the Danish anime community ... or, it would have been, if something had not gotten in the way. Last year when we had to cancel J-Popcon 2020, it had been exactly 20 years since we got a place to meet people with the same interest for the first time – without finding them online ourselves or convincing them to read this really cool Japanese comic first. For the first time, we had a place where we could gather around our hobby.

I clearly remember my own first J-Popcon back in 2005, when it was in Valby Kulturhus. I remember my own shyness, how I quietly watched an event with live dubbing with improvised lines, which was incredibly entertaining. I was probably a little cautious in the beginning, but that all changed with the help of the conguide where I had found something I wanted to watch in the cinema. It turned out that, after the promised content, they put on a mini series with episodes of 2-3 minutes, a comedy, which made the entire room cry with laughter. All of a sudden I felt like a part of the community. A community that hasn't left me since.

For those who cannot remember ever being without the internet or who grew

up in Copenhagen after the convention got as well-known as it is today, I think it can be hard to understand how isolated you felt growing up as an otaku in the small suburbs or the countryside in the beginning of the 2000s. But now we have conventions, the internet, even stores selling anime goods! We can watch anime as if we were in Japan and even a trip there is not as unrealistic as it was back then.

As fans of Japanese pop culture, we, in J-Popkai, also think it is pretty awesome, of course. But as organisers of J-Popcon, it is also a source of great challenges. As an event that started as primarily being a place where you could meet and watch the newest series in our cinema, we have had to reinvent ourselves multiple times. to Line Mørch. So, while we remember our past, we also turn the page and cheer for the future.

CENERAL RULES

We work hard to organise a fun and great J-Popcon for everyone, and to do that, we need your help.

With so many guests attending J-Popcon, it is important that you behave well, keep conversations and music at a reasonable sound level, throw trash in the bins, nowhere else – and treat each other with respect. Keep a distance, sanitise, and wash your hands!

At times, you will have to queue for certain parts of J-Popcon, which can be frustrating. Queues are inevitable at events like these, and we ask you to be patient. We encourage you to use the wait to talk to one another and meet new friends.

At J-Popcon, it is the organisers', trustees', and gophers' responsibility to maintain order. The organisers, trustees, and gophers wear J-Popcon T-shirts, respectively in dark blue, blue, and orange. We have a security team on hand during the night.

There are some rules that everyone needs to follow:

- Smoking is not allowed at J-Popcon at all, neither indoors nor outdoors. Drug use of any kind is prohibited, as per regular Danish law. If you carry prescription medicine on you, it is important that you can provide the proper documentation for this.
- Alcohol can be consumed in moderate amounts at our lounge (18+). ID will be checked. Only valid ID such as

driver's licenses and passports are approved. However, it is not allowed to be visibly drunk. Outside of this area, alcohol is forbidden.

- Violent behaviour or theft will result in an immediate expulsion from the convention, as well as charges being pressed against the offender.
- You are not allowed to touch or hug anyone without their consent. This rule also applies to Free Huggers, though we strongly encourage you not to bring Free Hugs signs this year. Free hug signs bigger than an A4 will be confiscated.
- Eating areas can be found in the entrance area and at our ØksBar. Eating outside of these areas is prohibited. No food or drinks are allowed in the Game Room due to the electrical equipment as well as in the Dealer Room due to the merchandise. If you eat at J-Popcon, you are expected to clean up after yourself.
- Do not block hallways, stairs, or doorways.

Any violation of these rules may result in an expulsion from J-Popcon.

We recommend that children under the age of 12 be accompanied by an adult.

If you have any questions, please feel free to contact us at the reception desk.

PHOTOGRAPHY RULES

If you take photos or video at J-Popcon, you must follow these rules of conduct. Failure to comply may result in expulsion from the convention.

- You may not take any picture or video at J-Popcon that can be used to identify individuals without their prior consent.
- Any picture or video taken at J-Popcon may not be used for commercial purposes, unless an agreement exists with J-Popcon about such use of the material. If you are interested in such an agreement, please contact J-Popcon's PR division. Contact information can be found on our website.
- Unless otherwise specified, flash photography is prohibited at our events, shows, lectures, etc.
- As a participant of J-Popcon, you agree to being photographed by J-Popcon's official photographers in green T-shirts in the common areas of the convention or in larger groups. If you participate in an official event, you automatically consent to J-Popcon using the material, taken by J-Popcon's official photographers, for PR purposes.







WEAPON & PROP RULES

The Danish weapons law is in effect at all times during J-Popcon.

Real weapons, functional or not, are not allowed at J-Popcon, even if the carrier has a firearms license to carry them. This includes, but is not limited to, firearms, and edged weapons. Breaking this rule will result in expulsion from J-Popcon and, in severe cases, the police will be contacted.

Realistic looking prop weapons and prop weapons made of metal must be approved by an organiser. Prop firearms must be marked with an orange or red tip at the mouth of the barrel. General tools, such as screwdrivers and pliers, must be justified and still pass a check at Weapon Control.

Props and weapons, where any length exceeds 30 cm of the carrier's height, and any overhang exceeds the length of your own arm, are not allowed at J-Popcon. Props and weapons used in the cosplay shows have to be checked, and must not exceed 2 meters. In addition to that, your headgear cannot protrude further from your head than 30 cm and it can weigh a maximum of 2 kg.

It is the guests' responsibility to have their weapons and props checked and approved by one of J-Popcon's weapon controllers at Weapon Check next to Check-in. Armour, weapons, or other metal objects are not allowed to have sharp edges, but must be blunt, so they do not endanger the other guests. In general, common sense should be applied when handling weapons and props, plastic or not. You will risk a warning and have the weapon confiscated, if used improperly.

J-Popcon reserves the right to confiscate any prop or weapon and keep them until you leave the convention, if an organiser deems it to be a danger to you or others. We also reserve the right to deny a weapon entry if the rules are broken.





AREAS

Information

The Information desk is the first place you see as you arrive at J-Popcon. Here, our loyal volunteers are ready to answer all your questions at all times during the entire weekend, whether it be about an event, a place you would like to visit, or J-Popcon in general. At our Information desk, you can also find our Lost & Found as well as buy different J-Popcon merchandise to celebrate our 20th anniversary with us.

Medics

If you experience any kind of discomfort or start feeling ill during the convention, you are always welcome to visit the medics. You will find them right next to the Information, where they are at your service at all hours during the entire weekend. If you end up in a situation where you need them somewhere else at the convention area, contact the nearest staff member and the medics will be with you as soon as possible.

Check-In

Right next to the Information desk is our Check-In area. Here, we scan your pre-purchased tickets and sell tickets for the entire weekend as well as single days for you to be able to enjoy all of J-Popcon. Remember to have your ticket open on your phone or printed if you pre-ordered them.

Props & Weapons Check

With all kinds of costumes, armour, and weapons, our Prop & Weapons Check is a necessary part of any convention to ensure everyone's safety. You have to stop by here before entering the convention areas if you carry anything from swords and armour to horns and helmets. If your prop or weapon have not been checked by our staff, you risk getting it confiscated.

We will give you a ticket, so you can come and collect your belongings when your day is over. We promise to take good care of it, but we must inform you that it's at your own risk.

Dormitories

J-Popcon's sleeping facilities can be found in Rysensteen Gymnasium, which is located right across from DGI-Byen. Accommodations will be in smaller rooms, so there will not be one giant dormitory. We still require consideration towards other guests, which means you must be quiet to avoid disturbing other guests. Entry to the dormitories is given with a dormitory ticket, but we ask that the area is only used for sleeping. Use of the facilities for anything other than sleeping will be referred to the lounge areas in the Dealer Room, Øksnehallen, and on the 1st and 2nd floor.

BOOTLEG

What are bootlegs?

Copies or reproductions of original merchandise made without the original company's consent are known as "bootlegs". Bootlegs are against the copyright and trademark protection laws. Bootlegs are made illegally, the creators of the anime or manga earn no money from the sales of bootlegs. Fan art is not considered bootlegs if the design is significantly different from the original design. Here we have made a list of precautions and things to check if you have any doubt whether a piece of merchandise is original or not.

In general

In general, if a piece of merchandise is badly made or seems to be of inferior quality, it is likely a bootleg. The same applies to things with missing copyright information. The copyright information must be located next to a © label. It should note the creator, the publisher, and the producer and should be placed on the item itself. If the packaging shows characters from more than one anime or manga, it is also a bootleg.

Bootleg posters

The copyright information should be printed on the front of the poster. If there is a number in the corner of the poster, e.g. 8143, it is a bootleg. If the print quality is low, for instance matte colours or thin paper, it is a bootleg. Please note that fan art is not considered bootleg as long as the design is clearly different from the original design.

How to spot bootleg plushies, T-shirts, and bags

The copyright information should be printed on the washing label.

Bootleg figurines

Copyright information should be printed on the figurine itself. If you know what the original figurine or its packaging looks like, you might be able to spot minor differences between the two. If this is the case, you are looking at a bootleg.

If the packaging contains a holographic sticker from the publisher, the figurine is an original, not a bootleg.

How to spot bootleg CDs

If the CD is published by Miya Records, it is definitely a bootleg. If there is no copyright information printed directly on the CD, or it doesn't contain the circel with a P in it followed by the production information, it is a bootleg.

This presentation will focus on the 2018 dramatisation of *Guardian*, a web-based danmei novel, discussing how danmei as a genre undergoes the Chinese censorship on homosexuality in the public sphere, the strategies used to get by censorship, and lastly airing a dramatisation of said genre.





INFORMATION ABOUT SEATS FOR DCC



The chairs are placed in blocks as seen on the picture. In the middle block, the rows are called M with 29 rows in total.

To the left, the chairs closest to the entrance and the lounge area, the rows are called V-A, V-B, and V-C, where A is the "block" closest to the middle and C is the "block" furthest away from the middle with 25-26 rows in total.

To the right, the chairs closest to the backstage area, the rows are called H-A, H-B, and H-C, where A is closest to the middle and C is furthest away from the middle, with 25-26 rows in total as well.

On the side wings, the numbers go across the A-B-C blocks, meaning that the green seat is Row H-C1 seat 22, the purple seat is Row V-B11 seat 249, and the orange seat is Row H-A16 seat 327.

When people are finding a place to sit, there will be a map on the screen where you can see which seats are free (the red ones are taken). There will also be numbers placed on the taken chairs, so those without numbers are free (please note that numbers can fall off by mistake).

International qualifications

World Cosplay Summit (WCS) is one of the world's biggest cosplay events with a cosplay championship. Cosplayers from 36 countries and regions all over the world meet in Nagoya, Japan at the beginning of August, where they participate in a number of cultural activities besides the final round of the championship.

European Cosplay Gathering (ECG) is the biggest cosplay championship in Europe, where cosplayers from 15 countries compete in both solo and group categories during the big finale at Japan Expo in Paris, France. The competition's primary focus is the visually beautiful and impressive acts.

Clara Cow's Cosplay Cup (C4) is a group qualification with a higher focus on the act itself. The competition takes place during AnimeCon Classic in the Netherlands, where groups from 19 countries compete for the grand prize.

The main goal with the Nordic Cosplay Championship (NCC) is to raise the bar of quality for cosplay at events everywhere. It has traditionally been Sweden, Norway, Denmark, Finland, and Iceland in the competition, as the Nordic part of the name implies, but recently Estonia, Latvia, and Lithuania joined as well. Focus is equally on craftsmanship and acting. It takes place at NärCon in Linköbing, Sweden.


